Project FeederWatch & Cornell University

November to April, Zoo docents and volunteers collect scientific data on the birds visiting our bird feeders for Cornell University.

Our data helps scientists monitor trends in bird population size, migration patterns, and the effects of wild fire, disease and introduced species on local wild birds.


